#### **DISTRICT 71 NEWS LETTER**

# October 9<sup>th</sup>, '13

We opened with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. The 10<sup>th</sup> Concept was read.

<u>DCM REPORT:</u> Welcome to the newcomers at district meeting. Your participation is key to the effective functioning of the service structure at district, area, and GSO.

Our district was represented by 5 people at the fall assembly. Here are some of the items discussed. Bridging The Gap contacts are working well and it was clarified at this Area Assembly that contacts from both Treatment and Corrections will use the same database. The Triangle, which is the Area Newsletter, is sent to all groups whether they pay for it or not. There are 8 newsletters per year and they are sent to each group's primary contact; usually that's the GSR. Groups are asked to be self-supporting and pay the \$10 per year subscription. (There are some Triangle subscription forms on the counter with the flyers. If you are not getting the Triangle for your group, please fill out and send in a form.) There are 246 groups in the Area that receive the Triangle and 9 groups have paid for them. We can do better with self-support and I suspect that a lot of groups do not know about the subscription fee.

We reviewed the Area budget for next year which is set up with the same committee system we have at district. There are some yellow envelopes with mailing labels in them for you to take to your group. Area 40 budget would be fully funded if each group contributed \$115 in the year.

The Area Assemblies have been at the Yogo Inn in Lewistown for decades. There is a concern about lack of space for committee meetings and accessibility for those with special needs. After much discussion, it was agreed to have an ad hoc committee research other places for Area Assembly meetings.

Thanks for supporting me to attend Area Assemblies; I appreciate it.

SECRETARY REPORT: Updates to contact list and attendance are being taken. Minutes approved.

TREASURER REPORT: John reported that Live and Let Live, Promises Group, and Keep It Simple donated to District this month. Along with their donations and the 7<sup>th</sup> tradition, total income was \$336.09. There were no expenses this month, leaving District a net income of \$336.09. District thanks the groups for their contributions.

<u>ROUND-UP</u>: Virginia reported that the committee is moving along and going well. Flyers were taken to Area and Dan gave the report at Area. They are still looking for committee volunteers as all positions are filled but could use extra help. They meet on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wed. of the month at 6:00pm at St. Ann's. Dan read the Round-up committee report that he read at Area 40. Scholarships will be

requested for Round-up as well and it is up to groups to give their own scholarships to home group members. GSRs are encouraged to bring this up at their business meetings. It was also encouraged to document the names of those that are receiving the scholarships so that they can be checked off when they come in for the Round-up.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

It was noted that there are job descriptions that have been made for District chair positions. It was discussed in past meetings that if people don't show up 3 months in a row, the position is open due to lack of attendance. There was a concern about committees such as P.I./C.P.C. not showing up. The grapevine position was voted open last meeting. There were a couple of new people in attendance tonight that voiced interested in these positions and they each shared their service history. The P.I./C.P.C. position duties were described and the possibility of voting someone in for this position was mentioned as well. Betty reminded everyone that Area is also a support for any committees if anyone needs suggestions or further job descriptions, etc. It was suggested that talking to Ken and asking him if he wants help with this position or if he would like someone else to take this position would be appropriate.
