As your new Corrections Chair, I would first and foremost like to thank Susan Hutz for the incredible work she had done as the former Corrections Chair. Her tireless work in this position laid the foundation for a smooth transition and gave me the much-needed confidence in moving forward.

On January 6th, a "tech savvy" friend of mine and I, sat down at my computer and we spent the morning separating and simplifying the men's and women's volunteer calendars, dividing emails addresses into two groups (men/women), and organizing the volunteer presentation and certification packet into one accessible format.

In the past few weeks, I've met with both Rhianna, our Committee Chair for Bridging the Gap, and Taz our Committee Treatment Chair. We were able to discuss our positions and duties, and how we might work together to make the whole process of reaching out to the "still suffering alcoholic" a little more effective. They were both very receptive, and I look forward to working with them.

Our women's calendar is full through March, and there are many dedicated women taking the meetings into the jail.

The men's calendar was mostly filled through January, leaving only a few times where I had to specifically text volunteers, asking if they were available to take a meeting in that week.

So far this month I've sent an introductory email out to the men and women each with their new calendar, and more recently I've sent a second email to the men in hopes that our February calendar could get filled. It would seem that while we do have several dedicated men volunteers for this service, we need more of them.

It is my hope that our "INTO ACTION" workshop will bring "a few good men" into the service of bringing hope to those incarcerated men in Flathead County Jail.

All in all, I feel confident and blessed to be in this new position, and very grateful to be of service to Alcoholics Anonymous.

Subscribers will receive discounts when ordering over multiple years, or by purchasing the 'Complete' option, which includes the print magazine and full access to the website and our new mobile app. Digital subscription prices will stay at the current rates. Active subscribers will stay at their current rate until their term ends. 
